COMPOSITION EACH TABLET CONTAINS:

Diazepam BP 5mg

EXCIPIENTS

Maize starch, Talc, Povidone, magnesium stereate

INDICATIONS

Muscle relaxant, sedative and relief of anxiety.

DOSAGE

As prescribed by physician

PHARMACOKENETICS

Diazepam is readily completely absorbed from the gastrointestinal tract. Peak plasma concentration occurs within 30 to 90 minutes after oral administration. It is metabolized in the liver and excreted in the urine mainly in the form of free or conjugated metabolites.

PHARMACODYNAMICS

Diazepam act on part of the limbic system, the thalamus and hypothalamus to induce calming effects. Benzodiazepines bind to benzodiazepine receptors which mediate sleep, affect muscle relaxation, anticonvulsant activity, motor co-ordination and memory.

ADVERSE/ SIDE EFFECTS

Drowsiness, Sedation, Muscles weakness, ataxia

CONTRAINDICATIONS

Diazepam should be avoided in patients with pre-existing CNS Depression, respiratory depression, acute pulmonary insufficiency and myasthenia

PRECAUTIONS

Diazepam should be use with care in patients with chronic pulmonary insufficiency, elderly or debilitated, impaired liver or kidney

OVERDOSE

Overdose of diazepam may produce CNS depression and coma. Symptomatic and supportive treatment should be given to the patients in this case. Activated charcoal may be given to patients who have taken more than 1mg/kg of diazepam within an hour.

DRUG INTERACTIONS

Diazepam should not be taken with antiviral such as HIV protease because they may inhibit their metabolism. Antibacterial like ciprofloxacillin and isoniazid also increase the half-life of diazepam. Alcohol enhances the sedative effect of diazepam.

PREGNANCY AND LACTATION

It is not safe for pregnant and nursing mothers unless prescribed by the doctor.
